

MISSOURI EVERGREEN CATALOGING TRAINING COURSE

Advanced cataloging

As a part of the Missouri Evergreen Consortium (MEC), all member libraries should understand that building a union catalog that is easy for our patrons to use and is consistent requires a common set of policies, practices, and training for creating and maintaining bibliographic records. These records are the shared property of the consortium, and they benefit all of our members and are for everyone's use. It doesn't matter which library created the record, who transferred it into the database, or who has edited it. As a consortium, we all share this data, and as such, we also share the responsibility of maintaining the quality and integrity of each bibliographic record.

With recommendations from the Missouri Evergreen Cataloging Committee, the Missouri Evergreen Executive Board sets standards for the creation and inclusion of these records. The Missouri Evergreen Cataloging Committee oversees quality assurance and cataloger training. To that end, we are creating a training course for cataloging correctly and efficiently. This course will be divided into two sections: **Basic Cataloging** and **Advanced Cataloging.** Each member library must have at least one Level 1 cataloger identified from their employees. Both levels will be required to take this course, which is made up of readings, how-to videos, practical work and a final certification exam based on their job responsibilities. After passing each level course, the participant will be presented with a certificate of completion. A passing score on the Basic course will be required to progress to the Advanced course. Cataloging librarians can take the Level 1 course at any time but must be recommended by their supervisor and director to be given the additional permissions in the database to allow them to do advanced work.

All training materials created for this course are the property of the Missouri Evergreen Consortium. All readings, PDFs, and practical work will be maintained on the Missouri Evergreen Consortium homepage and will be accessible asynchronously. This ensures that everyone has access to the most current training materials at all times. These materials will be updated regularly to reflect the current methods of cataloging by the Missouri Cataloging Committee as well as incorporating updates from the Evergreen system as they are created. Catalogers at either level must take the required course and pass the exam, regardless of time they have been working in Evergreen. This ensures everyone has the same training and can do the work as expected.

Advanced Cataloging

Advanced cataloging will continue looking at MARC, RDA, authority records discussion, and the philosophy behind cataloging. Practical work will include creating records for non-bibliographic materials. In addition to all the responsibilities of the basic cataloging course, the advanced cataloging will include readings, practical work in the training server, some research, and a final exam. Practical work will include adding serial bibliographic records, importing bibliographic records using the Z39.50 Protocol, creating and modifying authority records, merging bibliographic records, editing bibliographic records, overlaying current incomplete records with better records, deleting bibliographic records, and creating original MARC records. This course will incorporate everything taught in both courses and use every tool available to create the best original MARC record possible.

Catalogers wanting to do real-world work in the Missouri Evergreen server must pass the advanced cataloging final exam and be recommended by their supervisor and director to get the required system permissions to do real-world work in the MEC catalog.

Editing MARC Records

We need to edit records when the record data isn't quite what we want, whether it's removing extra tags or adding tags of data that the patrons might use.

First, I'm going to find a record in the catalog that needs some attention. I located a DVD that needs to be filled out: TCN 1309705

Here's the MARC record:

This isn't a bad record, but I'm thinking it needs a little tweaking. To do that, I'm going into the "MARC Edit" tab on the record and use the "Flat Text Editor" tab:



I then just go into the field and change the letters or wording accordingly. Typically, when I edit a record, it's to add information, not erase information. There are some exceptions we'll cover at the end of this section.

The first thing I'm going to change is the title in the 245 tag. The Black Whip is actually the heroine's secret identity name, making it a proper noun. The correct title is "Zorro's Black Whip." The end result looks like this:

The next thing I want to check is that the 336, 337 and 338 tags are filled out correctly. These are RDA tags that come into play when we are cataloging any type of media outside of printed material. These all look good.

In addition, the record is missing an 082 number, so I'm going to include one as well. Going to the OCLC <u>Classify site</u>, I did a tile search on Zorro's Black Whip and found this graphic:



The most popular DDC is this one, so that's what I'm going to add to this record:

I'm going to add another 500 information tag:

I think the 520 summary is a little weak, so I'm going to change it:

She is aided in her adventures by Vic Gordon, an undercover US government agent.

I'm also going to add a 610 tag to identify Republic Pictures as the original studio that created this serial.

In the 700 fields, I'm going to identify the co-directors by their contribution.

Also, since Linda Stirling is the lead in this serial, I'm going to list her first in the 7xx fields.

Finally, I'm going to add my library code (‡d MEC) to the 040 tag. This shows that I edited this record.

I wish the resource had an image. Typically, resources will show an image with the proper ISBN or UPC. These images are generated via a database subscription. If an image doesn't show up after editing the record, we can let the image vendor know and they might be able to add one.

After all my changes, I'll save everything. This is what the new record now looks like:

Much better and now the record has some very specific data about this particular serial. The big takeaway from this exercise is that as the cataloger, you get to make decisions on what to include in a MARC record. Remember that the more points of accessibility you include, the easier it will be for the patrons – and the staff – to find what they are looking for. In this case, more is better.

I mentioned that as catalogers we can remove information as well as add it. In some cases, the information included in a record has no bearing on the record we want for our records. For example, the Library of Congress MARC records include very specific 9xx tags about where the book is filed, whether it was a donation or if it was a replacement. These tags can be removed on a record-by-record basis. I will also remove URLs that do not resolve. In short, use your best judgment. If there's information there that our patrons can use, then keep it. Otherwise, delete it.

Notice in this list that items 1, 2, 6 and 9 all appear to be the same item. (It's also possible that 7 is as well.) I'm going to look at all of these together and determine if they can be moved into a single record.

My first step is to highlight the numbers of the records I want to look at. I do that by checking the box by the number on the right size of the screen. Selecting them puts them in a basket.

When creating a new bucket, it must have a specific name. Since I believe in truth-in-advertising, I'm going to call this bucket "Jim Croce CD." Then I'm going to click on "Add to new Bucket."

Once I select the lead record, I can either go into the MARC editor and edit that main record, or I can merge them first then edit the record. As usual, I'm opting to edit after the merge is done.

Before merging any records, make sure you copy some information from the excluded records if needed. Specifically, the 020 or the 024 tags that differ, possibly some of the 5xx or 6xx tags if they have any unique information in them etc. I typically copy and paste these into a text file that I can use in the editing step. The only information from this merge is the 264 tag in the third record, which shows that Time-Warner also released this album at one point:

When we have a book that is not in the ME catalog, we can use the Z39.50 protocol to see if another library has a record we can import.

First, I logged into the server and searched for ISBN 9780786438402. I got zero results.

My hopes were dashed as the ISBN came back with zero results. Not to worry. I switched tactics and decided to a title search --switching the query default to "Title" -- with the same libraries selected and ran the search again.

(This is not uncommon for a single search comes back with zero results in any database. In fact, I recommend that when adding a title to our library catalog that you run an ISBN search initially, followed by a title search if the ISBN comes back with zero results. This is part of due diligence on the part of the cataloger. Also, if I'm being honest, it's better to import a record, if at all possible, rather than to create one as copy cataloging is a huge time-saver! Better to import and edit that to recreate the wheel!)

From here, I started looking at these MARC records to see which one I liked the best to import. I typically select an OCLC record (MARC tag 035) and that has the most information -- I'd rather have too much information than not enough. Although you can't see it on this screen shot, records #2 and #3 on the list have this OCLC code attached to them at the far right. Since those appear to be OCLC records, I'm going to look at them first.

Some things to look at when deciding if the record you found is the one you want to import:

- The record title must match the physical item.
- The record author must match the physical item.
- The ISBN must match or be an additional ISBN listed on the verso page or verified in another database (Worldcat or Amazon are good choices for this.)
- The physical format of the item must be the same as what is listed in the record. <u>Do not</u> add different formats (mass market paperbacks, hardbacks, large print books, DVDs, <u>Blu-Rays, audio music, audio books or electronic books) to the same record.</u> (For

instance, a copy of "Great Expectations" the book would not go on the same record as

"Great Expectations" the audiobook. Each of these formats will need its own unique record.)

- Page count must match within 10 pages or less.
- Physical size cannot be more than a difference of 3 cm. between the record and the physical item.
- The edition statement must match.

If any one of items do not match the resource, you need to find another record. This is the same checklist you will use when you merge and overlay records.

I liked the fact that:

- a.) this is an OCLC record (Tag 035)
- b.) that all the match points listed above are in agreement

c.) that there are some good 5xx notes, including a summary (520 tag) and the table of contents (505 tag.)

Things I will add or change: There's no Dewey classification number (<mark>082</mark> tag) and it could use some additional <mark>650</mark> tags. But overall, it's not a bad record.

I can discount looking at the third record in the results page because the edition statement and the publication date (tag 260) are different from mine. After looking at the other records here for a quick comparison, I find that the second one really is the best record. I can edit this before I import it, but I prefer to do my editing when the record is in the system.

From here, I click the "Import" button.

As seen here, when you open the "<mark>MARC</mark> Edit" tab, you'll have two options for editing modes: "<mark>Enhanced MARC Editor</mark>" on the left and "<mark>Flat Text Editor</mark>" on the right.



Save Changes

Both editing modes have their uses, but I prefer to edit in the Flat Text editor if I can. I find it tidier and easier to add or delete tags. However, either mode will do the same job for simple editing. The "Enhanced MARC Editor" provides some selection options that the "Flat Editor" doesn't with regards to the 008 fixed field editing and as well as Authority validation.

From here I'm going to edit the record.

First, I'm going to add my three-letter library code (MEC) to the 040 tag at the end of the string. This shows that I edited this record.

Next, I'm going to add a 049 tag to the record with my library code. This shows that I imported this record. To add a code to the record, go to the end of the tag just before where you want to enter a new tag and hit enter on your keyboard. This will open a new space:

(Note: You can put new tags anywhere as the MARC record will read them in order of their number. I tend to put the tag where it should go numerically so that I know it's the right tag and its tidier in my mind. Your mileage may vary, of course...)

In this case, I have a pre-made tag I keep in a local text file so I can copy them any time I need to add them. My premade tags along with their notes look like this:

In the example above, I'm going to add a 049 tag to the record. Here's the result:

The next tag I come to is the 050 tag. This is the Library of Congress Classification number. This tag needs to be deleted per the Missouri Evergreen cataloging best practices. The reason is that it displays prominently on the MARC record in ME, causing confusion for both staff and patrons. It is also significantly different from the 082 Dewey number.

The next tag I want to add is 082, the Dewey Classification tag. To do this I want to see how other libraries have classified this book. Since it's a non-fiction book, I'm going to look for a non-fiction Dewey number.

I could go into some library OPACs and see how they classified it but I'm using this new OCLC resource called "<u>Classify</u>."

Here, I can do a title search and see other libraries holdings:

Based on this result, I'm going to add the 082 tag to my record with the Dewey number 741.5973, since that seems to be the most used item. Why re-invent the wheel?

Of course when adding any new tag you need to look at its indicators and subfields on either the <u>LoC MARC</u> <u>Format page</u> or the <u>OCLC Bibliographic page</u> to verify you're adding the right information.

So going back to the MARC record, I'm going to insert a <mark>082</mark> tag after the <mark>049</mark> tag. The <mark>082</mark> will have a <mark>0</mark> indictor (Full edition), a <mark>4</mark> indicator (Assigned by agency other than LoC) and a <mark>\$a</mark> tag (Classification number). Here's what it looks like:

Looking at the record, I'd like to include a few other 650 tags. I'm going to look at the LoC Subject Headings for some additional subject headings. I found two others I like:

Literature -- Comic books, strips, etc. Comic books, strips, etc.

I'm going to add these in as well. Since these are both LoC subject headings, both will get a first **O** indicator (No level specified) and a second **O** indicator (Library of Congress Subject headings). The **\$a** subfield will include the new subject headings, so they look like this:

That gives me four subject headings. As the cataloger, you can add more if you like, as these can be used by patrons to find similar materials. But per the Missouri Evergreen Cataloging Best Practices document, all records should have at least three subject headings. The subject headings for this record now look like this:

The Z39.50 search pulled up 93 hits, including books, DVDs, soundtracks, etc. Scrolling through the list, I'm looking for an OCLC record with a 1999 release, which is when the DVD was released per an internet search. On line #48, I find a record that looks promising:

Deleting Bibliographic records

A record can only be deleted if there aren't any items or call numbers attached to it. In addition, Missouri Evergreen system is configured to automatically delete a MARC record once all the items and call numbers attached to it are deleted.

However, there are situations where a bibliographic record that has no items attached may need to be deleted. For example, the wrong record is accidently imported or two different records were downloaded for the same resource. As the cataloger you have a few options: you can either overlay the wrong record with the correct one, you can merge records or you can delete the incorrect record.

The first step is to search the record in question in the database. In this case I looked for the book "Hollywood's Unsolved Mysteries" ISBN 1561710652



That generates this pop-up. Click on the "Confirm" button.



The refreshes the record with this note:

Creating records for non-bibliographic materials

Now we are going to catalog a resource that's not a book. (We'll get to bibliographic creation later.) Using all of our previously practiced skills, we can create a MARC record for any resource that we want to check out to patrons and that we want to track. This should only be done if a record cannot be found and copied or imported. This method can be used for anything: fishing rods, telescopes, cake pans, hotspots, toys, games, literally anything. Before doing this, ensure there isn't a current record you can use and there isn't one you can import.

First, go the "Cataloging" tab and select "Create New MARC record":

This takes us to the MARC template screen. These are templates developed by other catalogers that include some basic MARC tags for a specific type of resource. These templates aren't what I want as I'm going to create a record for an external CD / DVD read write drive for a laptop or desktop. Instead, I picked Playaway, which is an equipment type. Here's the "Playaway" MARC template:

The screen then refreshes and I'm into the new record. This gives me the basis of what I want to catalog. Most likely I will modify each tag and add numerous other ones. For the first part of this section, I will be editing in the "Enhanced MARC editor" as I will need to look at each option and see if it needs to be modified. Know too that this process is a little clunky as I'm going to trying to fit my object into options that might not be totally accurate – known as the square-peg-in-a-round-hole in cataloging theory.

I'll modify the fixed fields first, as best I can. Refer to OCLC's Fixed Field Webpage to fill out this field exactly.

By using the right mouse click, most of these fields will give you options to choose from.

For the rest of the record, I went back to the "Flat Text Editor" and added and deleted tags as necessary. Be sure to save your changes periodically. When you're working in the MARC editor program, the system thinks the session is idle. It will eventually time out and it will not automatically save your changes.

The first tag I modified was the 024 (UPC) tag:

Most of the technical information came from the box and was verified on Amazon. Of course, it's still not quite done as I still need to add an owning library, a call number and a bar code.

And this is my personal rule of thumb: when creating a new MARC record from scratch, allow at least an hour per item being created. This gives you plenty of time to fill out the record accurately and completely. Even though this record was shorter, it still took about 50 minutes to complete from beginning to end. Again, we

prefer you either add an item to an existing record when you can or import a good record when you need to, as these are both huge time-savers.

This is it! Everything we've done in both the basic cataloging and advanced cataloging sessions has led us to this point: the creation of a brand-new book that doesn't currently have a MARC record in MEC catalog, nor can it be imported. I've discovered as of late that many self-published books will not be recorded in the Library of Congress or OCLC. Knowing that, I will still do a title search and an ISBN search in MEC as well as the Z39.50 protocol to verify that a new record needs to be created. As we've established, I hate reinventing the wheel.

Let's begin!

I'm going to catalog a self-published book titled: "**The Golden Age Black Cat: Volume 1**" published by Gwandanaland Comics #1055, ISBN is 9781546560159. (These are the adventures of one of the first super-heroines in comics. She first appeared in August 1941, beating Wonder Woman to print by four months.) There is a minimal amount of information on this book from the book itself – it doesn't have a verso page and has scant publishing information in it. Most of my research is going to come from all the resources we've discussed: The Library of Congress, Worldcat, OCLC, other libraries, Amazon, and other databases that have pertinent information.

First let's do an ISBN search in MEC and the Library of Congress for both the title and the ISBN. Here are the results for the MEC catalog:

As I predicted, nothing so far. But I haven't given up. Next, I'll try WorldCat and see if the book is cataloged in OCLC. While I did get a few hits on other Black Cat books – namely a manga series and a Marvel Comics character – the one I wanted wasn't listed. Doing an ISBN search gave me similar results.

Now I'm going to create the MARC record. First from the Cataloging dropdown menu, I'm going to select "Create New MARC Record." Then I'm going to select the "book" template. Here's my starting point:



Now I'm going to start adding fields to fill out the record.

In discussing MARC records, we briefly looked at the fixed MARC fields, the 008 tag. In creating a new MARC record, we will need to either verify the information in those tags or edit them accordingly. To do this, we'll need to be in the record, go to the "MARC edit" tab, then select the "Enhanced MARC Editor" tab:

Since we've already discussed the **Type** field, lets looks the others as well, going left to right, one line at a time.

1st line:

- Elvl Encoding level. This code indicates the fullness of the record. The default is a blank which I left.
- **Srce- Source** identifies the source of the record. The "d" option means other, which indicates the record is not originally from a national bibliographic agency or a cooperative cataloging program.
- Audn- Target audience identifies the intellectual level of the audience for this resource. There are codes here for preschool up to specialized. I chose option "g" for general.
- Ctrl Type of Control Describes the archival level of the resource. The default is blank, so I left it.
- Lang—Language Code defines what language the book is written in. In this case, English ("eng")

- **BLvL Biographic level** I chose "c" which means this book is a collection and wasn't originally published together.
- Form Form of item describes the resource's form. Again, there are multiple format types available here. For a book, unless the form is clearly defined, leave this option blank.
- **Conf Conference publication** identifies if the resource came from a conference. The default is blank.
- **Biog Biography** describes if the resource has any biographical data in it. The default is blank.
- MRec Modified record for original cataloguing, the default is blank.
- **Ctry Country of Publication** a two or three code describing where the book was published. For books from the United States, a two-letter state code plus a u (for USA)

- **Cont Nature of Contents** a description of certain types of materials. The "6" here represents comics and graphics novels.
- **Gpub Government Publication** identifies whether the resource is a government publication. The default is a blank, which indicates this is not a government publication.
- LitF Literary form the "c" stands for comics. Oddly enough, this code is available on the Evergreen system but is not listed on the OCLC site.
- Indx Identifies whether a work has an index or not. The default is the blank, which means no index is available.

4th line



- **Desc -Descriptive Cataloging Form** defines whether the item has been cataloged according to the provisions of the International Standard Bibliographic Description (ISBD). We will always catalog to these provisions so "i" is the best choice.
- Ills Illustrations indicates if the resource has illustrations. There are a number of options available for this filed. In this case, "a" is the best choice since the book is completely illustrated.
- Fest Festschrift is a German term that is defined as a complimentary or memorial publication usually in the form of a collection of essays, addresses, or biographical, bibliographic, scientific, or other contributions. The default is blank, so I left it that way.
- **DtSt Type of Date / Publication Status** this code is used categorize types of dates in association with the resource. Since the date of publication is listed in the resource, the "s" option is the best choice.
- **Date1 /Date2** these are used if there are a series of dates involved for a publication If a magazine was published over five years, the start year would go in Date1 and the end year would go in Date2. For single publishing dates like a book the date of publication would go in Date1.

From here, I'm going to start building a MARC record.

The first thing i add is the 020 ISBN tags with two qualifiers, format and volume:

7. Original MARC Record creation

- A. Find a resource that is not in the MEC catalog. (note: self-published books, locally published books – especially cookbooks- or self-made music CDs of local singers or bands are great for this exercise.)
- B. Briefly describe the resource with a title, a creator, an ISBN or a UPC if available.
- C. Search the title and the ISBN in the following databases: the MEC catalog, the Library of Congress and WorldCat. Verify there is no record available for your item. Take a screenshot of all the searches to show the item doesn't exist. (6 in all). (You may include a screenshot from Amazon if the item is listed there.)
- D. Open up the MARC creation option for the resource you've chosen. Include as many tags as you want. However, there should be a minimum of 10 tags, including at least three 6xx tags if possible. The 040 tag, the 049 tag, and the 336-338 tags that you add do not count for this exercise but must be included. Be sure to include a 520 tag (You can count that one as one tag!)
- E. Copy the final MARC record.
- F. Get a screenshot of a search of your item from the catalog using the patron's screen.

G. Put all of these images and data into a Word Document, Google Doc or a PDF

labeled "7. Original MARC record."

Kits

Kit bib records can serve several purposes. They are often used when there are several formats together in one bib record (for example, a music CD with accompanying book and DVD) or when you are building a kit of different items that you want to circulate together. While kit bib records aren't as cut-and-dry as a print record, most fields will have coding for kits. If the kit has been compiled by the cataloger, always find some type of subject headings that pertain to the contents of the kit to help with discovery.

Equipment

Equipment records are often the trickiest, but mainly that's just because catalogers don't need to create them as often as other material bibs. These standards can be applied to many different things, like kits, realia, "Library of Things" materials, and other tricky items. When creating a MARC record for equipment, fill in as many of the fields (including fixed fields) as you can. There will most likely be a lot of added information in the 500 fields. Always find some type of subject headings that pertain to the equipment to help with discovery. <u>These types of special MARC records are often filled with judgement calls made by the cataloger.</u>
